

Flag Act of 2009

This act of the Legislative Council of Tribal Chieftains of the Native American Tribal Republic of Timucua shall serve to officially change the flag of the nation. The flag of the nation has been seen to cause some confusion as it is similar in design to the flag of the nation of Somalia. As a result of this the flag has been determined as being in need of change.

In order to maintain our flag colors a new design has been decided upon using the blue field and the white upon it. The new flag has been designed as a white square on a blue field. This flag design has been researched and is not in any way similar to any recognized or unrecognized nation that we have been able to find.

Therefore dated this 20th Day of November of 2009, the Legislative Council of Tribal Chieftains so passes this act which shall be titled the Flag Act of 2009 directing the Government of the Native American Tribal Republic of Timucua to change the flag to the design herein prescribed. This act has been voted upon and has been agreed unanimously upon by all members of the Legislative Council of Tribal Chieftains as needed and necessary. Therefore the signature of the Legislative Council Chairwoman and Executive Tribal Chieftain below place this law into effect in Timucua.
