Unilateral Declaration of Micronational and Tribal Independence of the Native American Tribal Republic of Timucua.

We hold these truths to be self evident that all people are created equal with certain unalienable rights given by the Great Spirit who created us all. These unalienable rights are Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness and that the native peoples of the continents of the Americas hold the right to self-determination which they have held since time immemorial.

Therefore in an effort to preserve and defend our Native American heritage and to pass to our offspring and descendants the truth, heritage, culture, sovereignty, liberty and independence of our people we do declare this $1^{\rm st}$ day of August in the year of our Lord 2008 AD our independence from the established order of the world and hearby retake our place among the nations of the world as the *Native American Tribal Republic of Timucua*.

With this declaration, we the native peoples and peoples relating to native heritage in the continents of the Americas in the area of the North American Continent known by the imposed name of Florida in the area between the border with the imposed state of Georgia along the $31^{\rm st}$ parallel of latitude North and the St. Mary's river to the North, to the Appalachicola River and the Gulf of Mexico in the west, to the coast of the Atlantic Ocean on our east and to the $28^{\rm th}$ parallel of latitude North to our south lay claim to our territory and re-establish our sovereign place among the nations of the world.

With this declaration we seek to live in peace with all of our neighbors and blood kindred of mankind here on the planet Earth. We seek in no way to disrupt the established order of the State of Florida, State of Georgia, or the United States of America in spite of these being imposed orders as a result of the European Conquest of our people beginning in 1565 A.D.

With this declaration we seek to establish our claim to our liberty, sovereignty, heritage and tribal independence and provide a place that is a home for all Native American peoples who have been left out of the established order of recognized native tribes and imposed nations and states. We also welcome those who through the pact of blood brotherhood or blood sisterhood choose to espouse our ideals, values, heritage and culture to join our nation and tribe and establish for themselves a home within it.

We lay claim to our sovereignty through the 9^{th} and 10^{th} Amendments of the U.S. Constitution, through the recognition given to native peoples through treaties written throughout the history of the United States as well as before it came into existance, also through the United Nations Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and through the United Nations Declaration of Human Rights as well as the Montevideo Convention on the Composition of Legal International States.
